



## **Chuck "Feets" Minert to Receive the Edison Dye Lifetime Motocross Achievement Award!**



Iconic figure Chuck "Feets" Minert will be honored with the Edison Dye Lifetime Motocross Achievement award on Sunday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Charles "Feets" Minert was one of the best off-road racers in America during the 1950s. He won the popular Catalina Grand Prix in 1956 and was a leading rider before the days of specialization. Minert excelled in all types of motorcycle racing from speedway to trials, desert racing to scrambles, and later, in motocross.

Minert rode a factory-backed BSA for much of his career. His racing career spans from 1946 to the occasional REM events he still races at Glen Helen! A full biography on Chuck will be included in this year's [Dubya World Vet Motocross Championships](#) event program.

Tom White has once again commissioned artist Mark Borzak to create the traditional Edison Dye Lifetime Motocross Achievement Award poster. The first 100 fans in line at the autograph signing session (directly following the

Mark designed the poster to provide plenty of space for the autograph of the Edison Dye Lifetime Motocross Achievement Award recipient (this year it is Chuck "Feets" Minert), as well as the past stars who will be at the ceremony to celebrate the early years of motocross in our great nation.**

The autograph signing session will be located in the Glen Helen/Troy Lee Museum. The ceremony that precedes the autograph session begins at noon, and will take place on the museum balcony. This is a very interesting and enjoyable presentation, hosted by Tom White.
